Adoption Landscape

- ❖ Too often in the adoption field, the adoptee perspective is subordinated to that of the adoptive parent.
- First/birth parents are part of the story
- Adult adoptees are the truest experts on their own experience.
- Adopted people deserve to know their full heritage and should have access to all of their records and birth history.
- Adoption includes loss

Racial Landscape



- 0-5: Using words, include being born and first/birth parents
- 6-10: Focus on other people's stories, books, movies
- 11 and up: Focus on ethics, fairness and more complex details

Strategies: Matching Siblings



- 0-5: Matching, claiming race/ethnicity
- 6-10: Shared experiences in cultural community
- 11 and up: Trusting members of their heritage community

- 0-5: Words, language and values statements
- 6-10: Shared experiences in cultural community
- 11 and up: Trusting members of their heritage community

Strategies: Cultural Currency & Language



- **0-5**: Exposure
- 6-10: Teams, social groups, values
- 11 and up: Social justice from within the community

Heritage & Adoption Mentors



Strategies: Heritage & Adoption Mentors



- 0-5: Grown ups & children
- 6-10: Learning about social justice issues within communities
- 11 and up: Trusting members heritage & adoptee community (without parents)
